

Make your very own woodland creature, with moveable arms and legs. You could add a stick to the back to transform it into a puppet or attach a loop of string to hang it on your wall.

YOU WILL NEED

- * A4 or A3 sheets of card
- * Scissors
- * Tracing paper or access to a photocopier
- * Pencil and pencil sharpener
- * Colouring-in pens or pencils
- * Split pins (4 per character)
- * Strong glue
- * Sticky tack or cork



- 1. Choose from the opposite page which head, body, arms, legs, wings and tail you would like your creature to have.
- 2. Trace the body parts that you want to use onto A4 or A3 card (depending on how big you want to make your character). Alternatively, photocopy the opposite page and then glue it onto the card.
- 3. Colour the body parts in and then cut them out with scissors. Glue the head and tail onto the body and wait for them to dry.
- 4. Make a small hole for the split pins, where shown, on the body, arms and legs. Place a piece of sticky tack or cork on the back of the card where you want to make the hole and carefully push the point of a pencil through from the front to the back. Adult assistance might be required for this bit. Put a split pin through the holes to join the arms and legs onto the body, securing at the back by folding out the pins.
